Your Paralegal, With AI: The Real Productivity Difference

This isn't AI instead of a paralegal. It's the same paralegal, the same judgment, the same client relationships — with the repetitive 80% of the job running in the background instead of eating their day. Here's the honest before-and-after.

Paralegal alone vs. paralegal + AI automation

Capacity and time figures are directional, based on removing manual intake logging, follow-up, and data entry from a paralegal's workload — actual impact varies by firm and lead volume.

Same person, more leverage

Nothing in that table replaces judgment. A paralegal still reads a client's situation, catches the case that doesn't fit any template, calms an anxious client through a multi-year process, and preps attorneys with the context only a person would know to flag. AI doesn't do any of that — it isn't trying to.

What changes is everything upstream of judgment: the intake that used to sit in an inbox overnight, the follow-up that depended on whoever had a lighter week, the CRM fields that got backfilled whenever there was time. Remove that layer and the same paralegal — same headcount, same salary — has meaningfully more hours for the work that actually needs them.

Why this beats hiring your way to more capacity

The alternative to automating the repetitive 80% is usually hiring another paralegal to handle the overflow. The median US paralegal salary is \$61,010/year (BLS, May 2024) — before employer payroll tax and benefits, which typically push the fully-loaded cost to \$6,300-7,100/month. That's the honest cost of adding capacity through headcount: a new hire, 60-90 days of ramp time, and a manager's time spent training them.

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Frequently asked questions

Does this replace my paralegal?

No. It removes the repetitive, always-on parts of intake, follow-up, and data entry from their plate so they spend more time on the judgment-based work only a person can do.

Where does the "50-60% more capacity" number come from?

It reflects the hours a typical paralegal spends on manual intake logging, follow-up emails, and CRM data entry — work the automation takes over entirely. The exact gain depends on your current lead volume and how much of that work your team does manually today.

Do I need to change my staffing to use this?

No. Most firms add this alongside the team they already have — it plugs into the CRM and intake process you already run, rather than requiring a new hire or a restructure.

What if my paralegal already handles follow-up well?

Great paralegals still take vacation, get sick, and clock out at 5pm. Automation covers the hours and volume spikes no single hire can, without displacing the parts of the job they're best at.

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
